Finding a Beacon of Light and Hope

Growing up in Virginia, David found himself lost and disconnected at an early age. Broken family relationships impacted him throughout his teen years leaving him uncertain as to what the next chapters would hold.



David graduated high school and was enthusiastic to attend a local community college. College meant he had an opportunity for a fresh start. But after three years of college, he realized he enjoyed working more and dropped out.

A relationship and a desire for change brought David to San

Antonio. He obtained a full-time job at a community bank where he obtained both technical and soft skills. However, the constant demands and stress associated with working in a call center environment became more than he could manage. The stress of his job coupled with the desire to be back in

Virginia closer to his mom triggered severe anxiety.

David eventually left the company, but at the cost of his mental well-being and damaged self-confidence. He struggled to find employment. With only a high school diploma in hand, he received phone calls from only three out of one hundred applications he "Goodwill helps guide you when you are lost. Goodwill San Antonio Partners With the Community to Re-engage Opportunity Youth

With more than 30,000 young people in Bexar County between the ages of 16 and 24 neither in school nor working, Goodwill San Antonio has partnered with the City of San Antonio and Communities In Schools on a comprehensive initiative to re-engage young adults who are currently disconnected from education, employment, or major social institutions.

The NXT Level Youth Opportunity Center, inside the Frank Garrett Multi-Purpose Center at 1226 NW 18th Street, opened its doors on February 15th and is the first of its kind in Texas. The center aims to connect with the community's most vulnerable youth, by providing critical social and emotional support as well as education and career resources to help young people get back on track and navigate a successful future.



The center, managed by the City of San Antonio, is staffed with life and career coaches from Communities In Schools, a non-profit

serving at-risk youth, and Goodwill San Antonio. Through supportive one-on-one sessions, participants and coaches from Communities In Schools and Goodwill work collaboratively to develop an Individualized Service Plan that provides guidance on overcoming life barriers and establishing an education or career pathway for forward advancement.

According to research conducted by Measure of America on disengaged youth, San Antonio ranked 20 out of 25 of the largest metropolitan areas in the United States with the highest rate of youth disconnection. Studies show adults who were disconnected as youth are less likely to own a home, less likely to be employed as an adult, and less likely to experience good health.

Investments in the NXT Level Youth Opportunity Center by the City of San Antonio, combined with support from JPMorgan Chase & Co. through a \$150,000 grant to Goodwill San Antonio, strengthen the economic and social health of the San Antonio community. With many young people wanting to further their education, obtain

He registered and began classes with the simple notion that earning a certification meant he would have actually completed something.

Although David had already acquired many of the skills being taught in the class, the Administrative Assistant program taught him more than he ever expected. For David, the class was not so much about the content, but rather the accomplishment and experience. He and his fellow classmates became a family. They supported one another both in and out of the the right classroom. Organically, David became a mentor imparting his knowledge to others who needed additional assistance. David completed his externship and graduated Valedictorian of his class.

Following completion of his certification, David was hired by Goodwill San Antonio's Business Services division where he works at Randolph Air Force Base as a Records Management Support Associate. It was a call he never expected, but one he is extremely thankful to have received.
